Nora P. Lynch March 24, 1932-Apríl 30, 2022

When Nora was born, she lived at 150 Greenwich Street in NYC, which is now the site of #4 World Trade Center. A year later, her family moved to Brooklyn where she grew up. She graduated from Fordham University with a Degree in Speech Pathology and Dramatic Arts and attended Queens College where she received a Master's Degree. Nora later attended Laurence University in Sarasota, FL and was awarded a PhD in 1972. For most of her career, Nora worked at Western Suffolk BOCES in Dix Hills as a teacher for the deaf. The program was housed in churches and then the James E. Allen Learning Center in Dix Hills. She was later moved to an itinerant teaching position servicing deaf students in many of the 18 component districts. Nora enjoyed working with the deaf and hard of hearing population for over 30 years and enjoyed meeting colleagues in the various school districts, including Mary O'Donnell who she studied with in Ireland and Kathy Conway from Division 7. What a testament it is to Nora when you think of all the young people who she assisted so they could navigate their lives to the fullest capacity!

Nora was predeceased by her loving husband Joseph Francis who was a retired member of the FDNY and became a Special Ed teacher on Rikers Island. They honeymooned in Havana, Cuba in 1955 and lived in Briarwood, Queens until their house was built when the Mayfair Estates was developed in 1958 in Commack. Nora was one of the two original owners in the old neighborhood resting on former potato farms!

Nora was a member of Division 3 for 32 years. She was a dedicated Hibernian and leader who always focused on the task at hand and who went up the offices on the division and the county boards becoming president of both. She attended many conventions with her friends Della Weissenberger and Sheila Geraci. Sheila said Nora was an impressive Hibernian who dotted every "i" and crossed every "t". Nora was an honoree at Division 3's St. Patrick's Day Dance and was honored at the county ball as the outgoing president. She was also a member of the Celtic Degree team for over 20 years and performed in several roles...this was likely a way for her to fulfill her love of theater. She helped to run many dances at Division 3 and as the County Vice President co-chaired two county balls. Nora continued to attend

division and county events and could count on her neighbors and fellow Hibernians Della and Joe Weissenberger for a ride to a dance or to the County St. Brigid Day.

Nora was also a very active member of the Catholic Daughters, serving as president at the same time she was LAOH president and was very involved in Christ the King Church where she served for many years as a Lector. Her family, her faith, her community and heritage were all very important to her.

Though she was not able to attend Division activities in recent years, Nora continued her membership, her friendships and her bond with her sister Hibernians, living our motto of Friendship, Unity and Christian Charity.

May God bless Nora and hold her in the palm of His hand. She will be dearly missed.
