The 1916 Easter Rising By Tom O'Reilly, Division 3 Historian

The 1916 Easter Rising was a clandestine operation orchestrated by seven men, primarily members of the Irish Republican Brotherhood (IRB), forming a "Military Council" just after the outbreak of World War I. The leaders included Tom Clarke, Sean McDermott, Patrick Pearse, Thomas MacDonagh, Joseph Plunkett, James Connolly, and Eamon Ceannt. Their plans were concealed from the broader membership of the Volunteers and leaders of the IRB and Volunteers, such as Dennis Cullough, Bulmer Hobson, and Eoin MacNeill.

The insurgents declared an Irish Republic with Pearse as President and Connolly as commander-inchief, occupying strategic positions around Dublin, including the General Post Office (GPO), the Four Courts, the South Dublin Union, Boland's Mill, Stephen's Green, and Jacobs' biscuit factory. Despite their efforts, the Rising lacked widespread support among the Dublin public and faced condemnation from various political factions.

The 'Proclamation of the Republic', read by Patrick Pearse in front of the General Post Office in Dublin on Easter Monday, April 24th, 1916, was a pivotal moment in Irish history. It not only asserted Ireland's sovereignty as a sovereign, independent state but also served as a declaration of rights for its citizens. The document emphasized the right of the Irish people to the ownership and control of their destinies, despite centuries of foreign rule. It declared religious and civil liberties, equal rights, and opportunities for all citizens, with a commitment to the happiness and prosperity of the nation. The proclamation envisioned a future where the Irish Republic would be governed by a representative National Government, elected by suffrage. It invoked the protection of the Most High God and called upon the Irish nation to prove itself worthy of its noble destiny through valour, discipline, and sacrifice for the common good.

<u>Note:</u> Of the 485 people killed, 260 were civilians, 143 were British military and police personnel, and 82 were Irish rebels, including 16 rebels executed for their roles in the Rising. More than 2,600 people were wounded. Many of the civilians were killed or wounded by British artillery fire or were mistaken for rebels. Forty children were killed in Dublin City slums. Seventy women were jailed after 1916. Of 1,600 involved in the Rising 200 were women. From Cumann na mBan.
